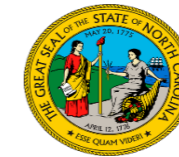


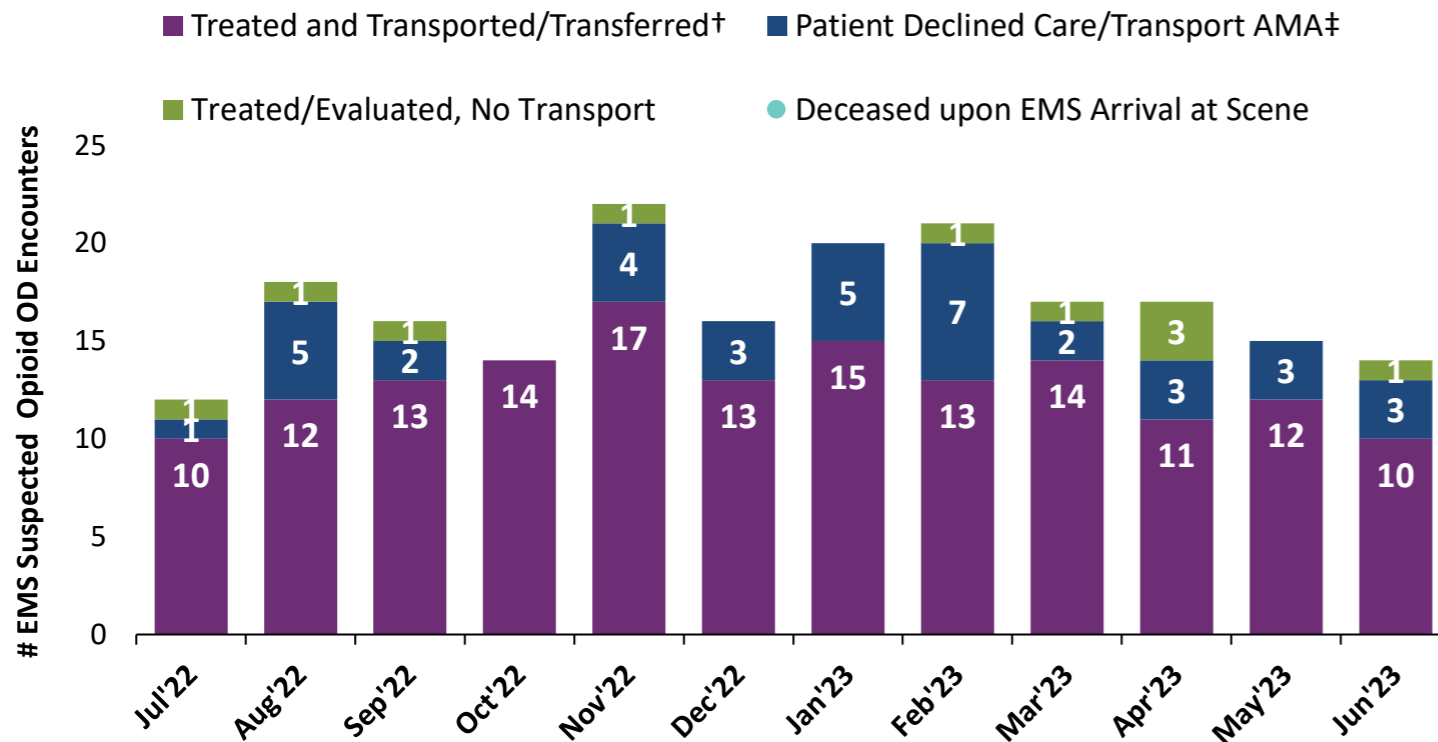

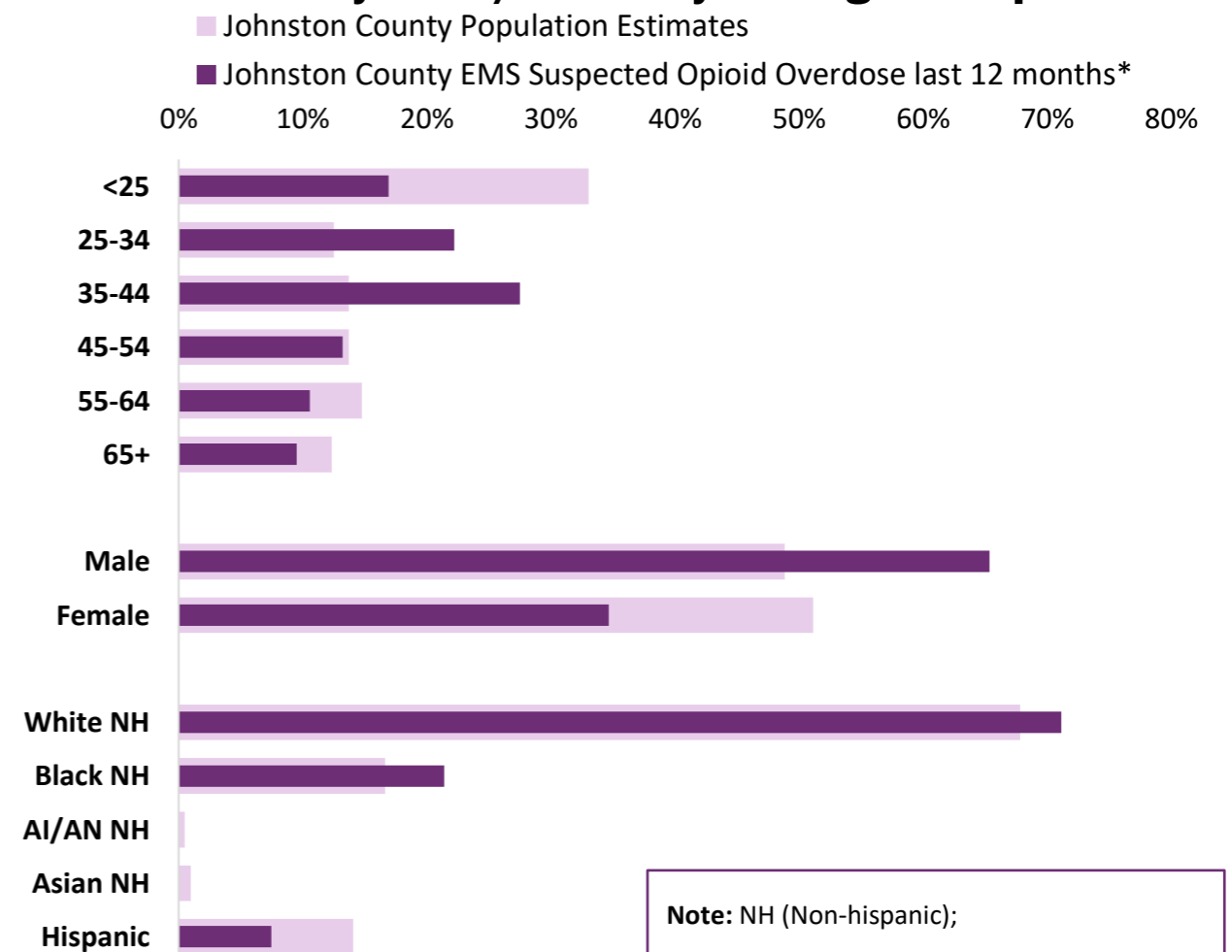
Year to date (Jun 2023), 102 of the 104 suspected opioid overdose encounters in Johnston County received naloxone, and 94 (92%) had an improved response to naloxone.
