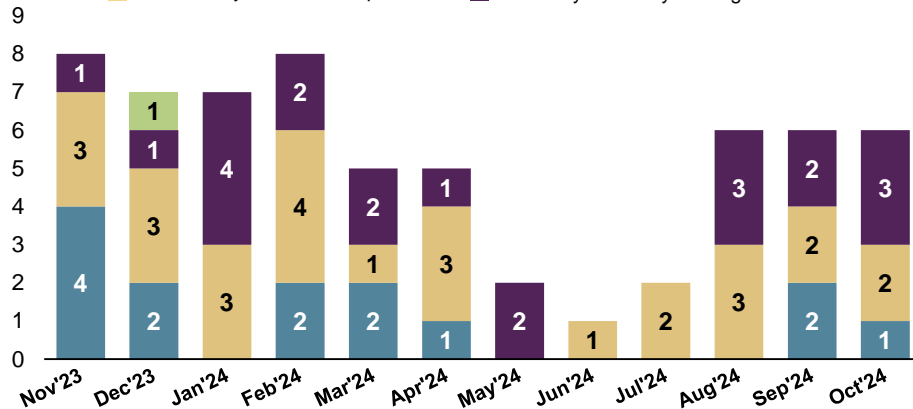

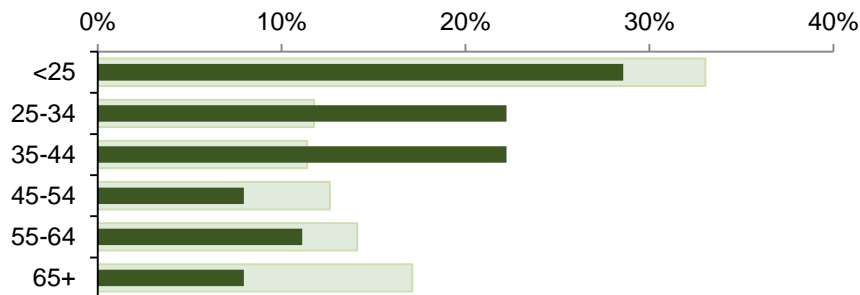

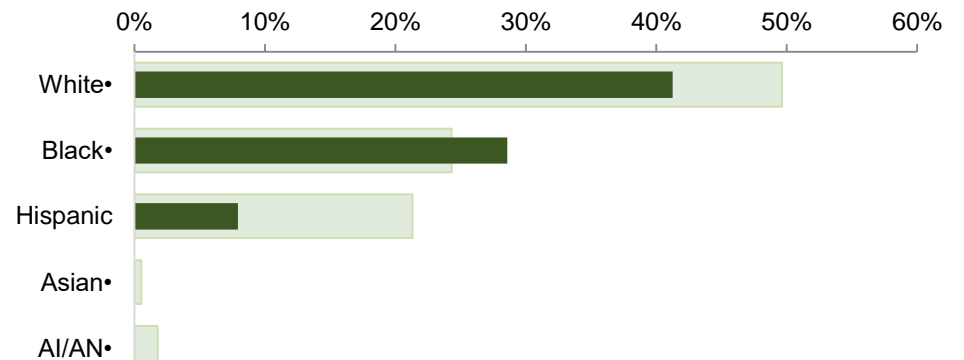
Opioid Overdose ED Visits by Age Group
